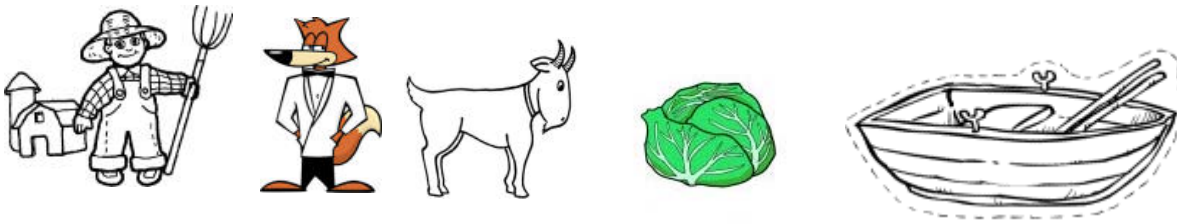


RIVER CROSSING PROBLEM



A **farmer** has a **FOX**, a **GOAT**, and a **CABBAGE**.

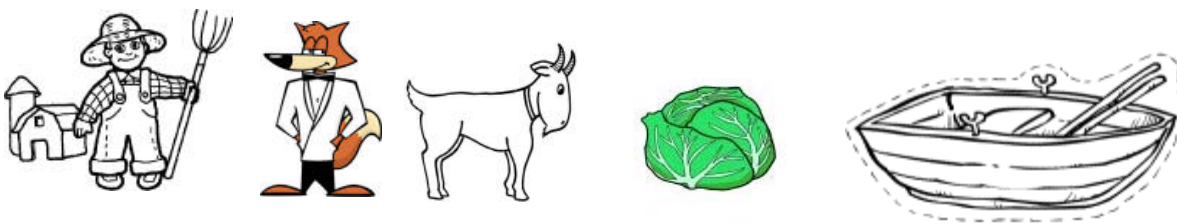
He wants to **cross a river**, but his **boat** will hold only **one item** beside himself.

He cannot leave the **FOX** with the **GOAT**, or the **GOAT** with the **CABBAGE**.

How can he get all **THREE** across the river?

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RIVER CROSSING PROBLEM ~ THE SOLUTION

Take the GOAT first.

Leave the FOX with the CABBAGE.

Row back and pick up the FOX.

Take the FOX across and bring back the GOAT.

Leave the GOAT and take the CABBAGE cross.

Leave the FOX with the CABBAGE.

Row back and bring the GOAT.

Everyone is now across safely!
